BEATLEMANIA COMES TO GREENVILLE

As part of the Greenville Central School District's Homecoming Weekend, the Tri-M Music Honor Society and The Greenville Educational Foundation will sponsor a **BEATLES TRIBUTE CONCERT ON OCTOBER 2 at 8PM in the HS Auditorium**. A group called **THE MYSTERY TOUR** will take the stage at Greenville High School.

When it comes to recreating the sounds of the Beatles, the Connecticut-based tribute band the Mystery Tour has a secret weapon in its arsenal -- a fifth Beatle. In addition to the traditional Fab Four, the Mystery Tour features a fifth member on keyboards in order to replicate the intricate orchestrations of the Beatles' later period from the strings of "Golden Slumbers" to the trumpet solo of "Penny Lane".

David Pilchek, who plays John Lennon in the Mystery Tour, said the group formed about 10 years ago. "We were all friends before in different Beatles bands; we found the other bands were not as good as when we all got together, so we formed our own".

Billed as "Connecticut's favorite Beatles tribute band", the Mystery Tour faithfully recreates the sights and sounds of Beatlemania with authentic instruments and costumes. The band's shows feature Beatles hits like, "A Hard Day's Night", "I Saw Her Standing There" and "Here Comes the Sun".

Pilcheck said the entire spectrum of the Beatles' musical career is covered, including "The Ed Sullivan Show," "Rubber Soul," "Revolver," "Magical Mystery Tour," "Abbey Road" and "Sgt. Pepper". In addition, each member performs decked out in full-fledged '60s garb.

Pilcheck said the "hardest songs to recreate live are the ones the Beatles never got to perform live themselves -- those that were studio creations, tunes like "Strawberry Fields", "Magical Mystery Tour", "Penny Lane", "Hello Goodbye", "Golden Slumbers." But, the Mystery Tour members are up to the challenge and with the help of the fifth member Pilcheck promised those songs would all be performed with faithful attention to detail. "(It's) all stuff we are going to play and recreate live".

In addition for this year several special presentations have been scheduled for parents and community members on topics relevant to the District and our students. These are scheduled for Saturday mornings on the dates listed below from 9:00 am to 11:00 am and will be held at Ellis Elementary School.



September 18 Needham Risk Management Student Health and Safety

The Greenville Central School District's safety and health consultant, Michael Needham, CSP, RES, CFPS, CET, of Needham Risk Management will present a community workshop on the school's emergency management initiatives. Mr. Needham will describe the school's planning, drilling, and training as it relates to

school emergencies such as fires, threats of violence, natural and technological disasters, and medical emergencies such as severe allergies and diabetic concerns. He will also provide information about the school district's, parents and community's roles during times of emergency and will be available to respond to community member and parent questions. Michael is a Board Certified Safety Professional, Registered Environmental Scientist, and Certified Fire Protection Specialist with over 20 years of experience in school health and safety issues.

Current and Legal Issues in Education

Ms. Bourassa will present information on current legal issues in public school education and provide a general Q & A opportunity relative to the topics presented.

November 6 Jack Agati The Goals of Misbehavior

Identifying the goals of a child's misbehavior is a necessary first step in successfully managing those misbehaviors. This program is designed to help participants distinguish between first time behaviors and recurring, purposeful ones. The goals of this session are to help the participants understand why misbehaviors occur, distinguish between the various goals of misbehavior (attention, power, etc.), determine each goal by using three identification techniques, explore the elements used in power struggles and how we can effect changes in those situations.



January 8 Update on District Master Plan

Stieglitz Snyder Architecture and the District have been working for the past two years to outline a master plan for the school district campus and facilities to support an educational program for now and into the future over a thirty year time period. As a result of input from faculty, staff and various community stakeholders, discussion at this meeting will provide participants with the design and status of the plan to date.



March 5 Curriculum and Instruction

The Quality Education Committee (QEC), co-chairs Colleen Hall and Kenneth Landervischt, provides leadership for the instructional program in Greenville Central School District. The QEC oversees the Curriculum Management System, based in Rubicon Atlas, and is responsible for district instructional recommendations to the Superintendent related to planning, design, implementation, assessment, budget planning for curricular reviews, and the identification of strategic instructional issues. Academic success for

every child and the development of good character in all students are important goals. While challenging students with high academic standards and expectations for achievement through innovative programming and instruction we also work to support and encourage a school-homecommunity partnership based in respect, responsibility, caring, honesty, and healthful lifestyles.
